

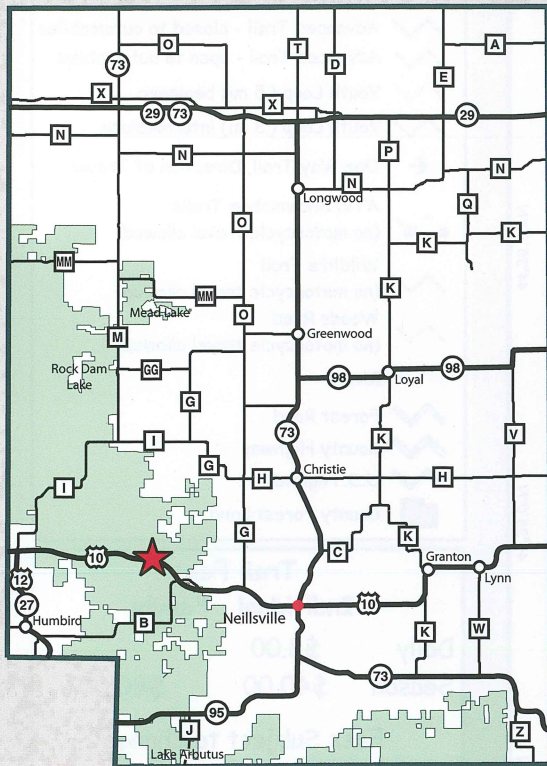
Trail Regulations

Clark County strives to provide pleasant and memorable experiences for all forest visitors. Trail use regulations must be honored, to assure the future of motorcycle recreation in Clark County.












Trails are primarily marked with white fiberglass posts and periodic motorcycle decals. **Motorcycles may only operate on the designated trail.**

All motorcycle trails are closed for the period of March 15th to May 14th of each year and during shooting hours of gun deer season.

Please observe all Wisconsin motorcycle laws. For complete listing of these regulations, contact your local WI-DNR.



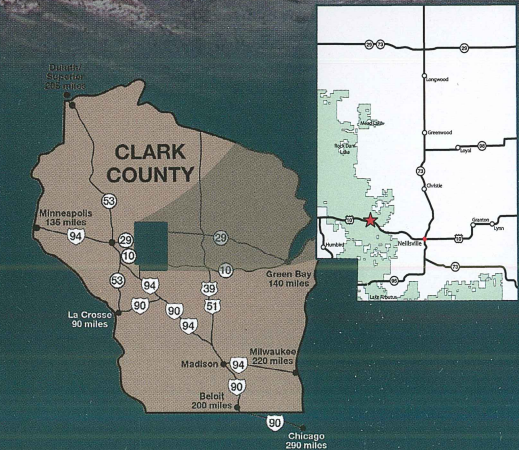
Code Of Ethics

-  Wear appropriate safety apparel.
-  Keep exhaust systems legal—spark arrestors are required by state law. Excessive noise hurts our sport.
-  When trails are wet, take it easy on soft ground. Remember, somebody has to fix and maintain torn up sections of the trail.
-  Pick up your litter so that someone else doesn't have to do it.
-  Maintenance projects on trail are done on a volunteer basis. Your help is greatly appreciated. Call Larry Strangfeld at (715) 743-3893 for work days.
-  Adults, please stay off the kids course, this is strictly for the younger riders.
-  Adults, be a GOOD role model for the kids, they have to learn their riding habits from someone.
-  The western loop is family oriented and easier to ride than the more challenging east side, ride within your abilities and skill level.
-  Keep speeds SLOW in parking area for safety and to minimize dust.
-  Use common sense. It is a privilege to ride on county property. Let's all work hard together and see this system expanded with responsible trail use.
-  Stay on designated trails! Riders who can't stay on designated trails are not welcome here.

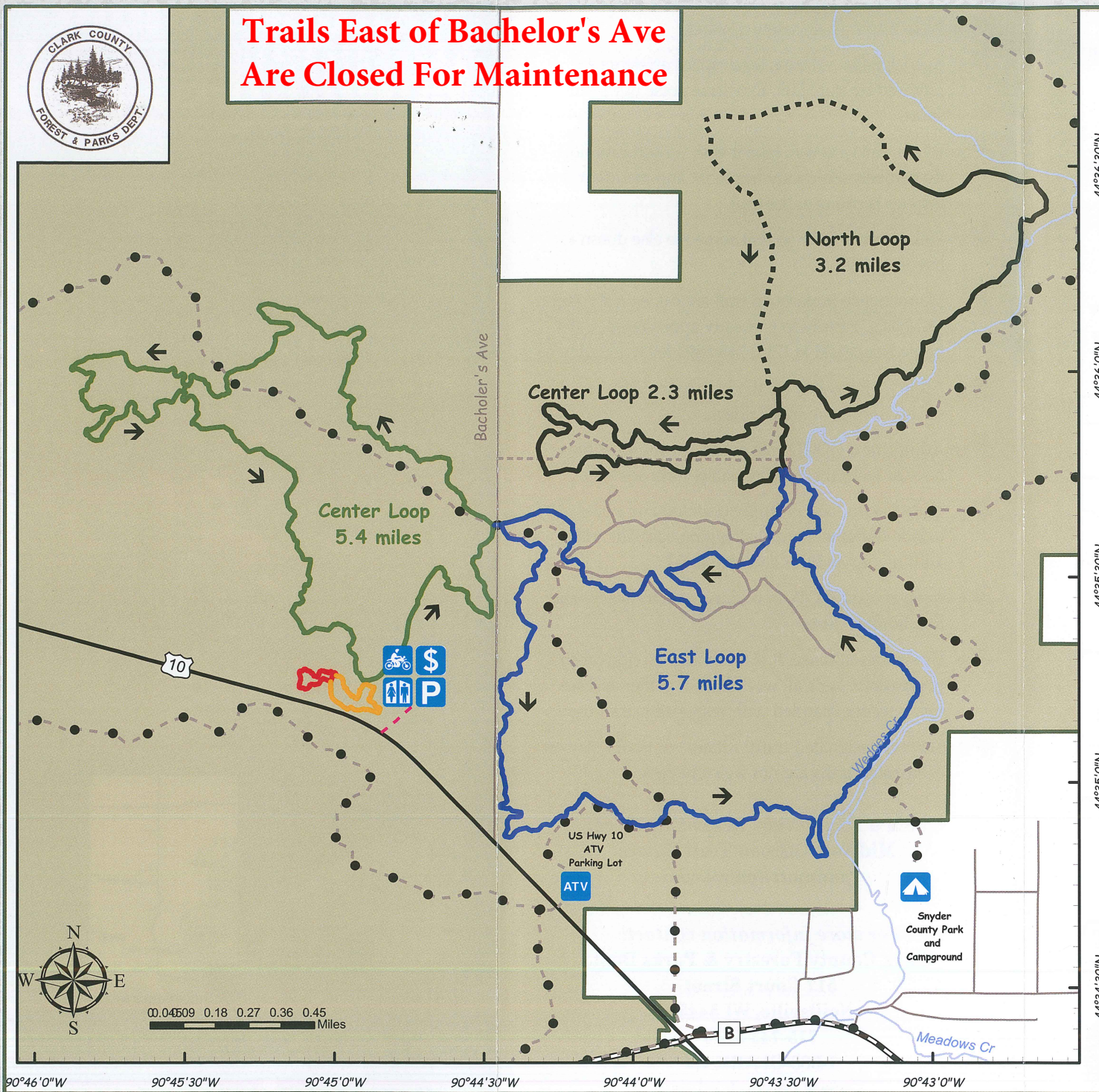
