Attached, is the bid prospectus for the May 8, 2019 Clark County Forest Timber Sale Bid Opening. The prospectus will also be posted online on the Clark County Forestry & Parks Dept. website (http://www.co.clark.wi.us/index.aspx?NID=704). Offers will be taken by sealed bids on each tract until 11:00 a.m., Wednesday, May 8, 2019. No late bids will be accepted, and all bidders are welcome to attend. Bids will be opened starting at 11:00 a.m. in the auditorium (room 101) at the Clark County Courthouse, 517 Court Street Neillsville, WI. The auditorium is located on the 1st floor, at the northwest entrance to the Courthouse. The Forestry and Parks Committee will award all contracts on Tuesday, May 14, 2019. Sealed bids for those tracts not sold on the May 8, 2019 bid opening will be received and opened at 11:00 a.m. June 6, 2019 in the Forestry & Parks Department office (room 103) at the Clark County Courthouse. A list of unsold tracts will be available on request from the Clark County Forest and Parks Department. Tracts not sold following the June bid opening are available for direct purchase at 10% above minimum bid value unless otherwise agreed upon by the Forestry & Parks Department as per department policy. Contact this office for more information.

FOREST CERTIFICATION

The area encompassed by these timber sales is certified to the standards of the Forest Stewardship Council® (FSC® C006090) FSC 100%.

REMINDERS FOR PROSPECTIVE BIDDERS

The prospectus page doubles as the bid sheet. There are spaces provided next to each product to enter bid values and the page can be submitted with your 10% bid bond.

TIMBER SALE CONTRACT 5 – Purchaser, prior to any performance under the contract, shall provide the Seller with a certificate of insurance indicating that Worker's Compensation Insurance coverage is provided for all employees working under this contract, <u>regardless</u> of exemptions in Chapter 102, State.

TIMBER SALE CONTRACT 11(B) Regeneration Cuts – All remaining live trees 2 inches in diameter at DBH and larger shall be cut, unless otherwise specified on the timber sale map. Non-merchantable tree stumps shall be no higher than 6 inches.

TIMBER SALE CONTRACT 40(F) – All cut products sold by weight that are not weighed within 30 days, will be cord scaled by the Seller and converted to tons.

TIMBER SALE CONTRACT 44 – Advance stumpage payment is required to purchase haul tickets.

BIDDING INSTRUCTIONS

All pulpwood, bolts and co-mingled products will be bid by the ton to 4 inch top diameter. No cord bids will be accepted for these products. If you wish to whole tree chip or harvest fuelrods, see page 3 for the Clark County utilization allowance. Sawlogs will be bid by the thousand board feet (MBF).

The Scribner Decimal C Log Rule shall be used for scaling hardwood sawlogs. The Scribner Decimal C Log Rule or cord scaling (converted to MBF using 2.44 cords/MBF) may be used for scaling pine sawlogs. Locked box ticket system or on-site cord scaling (converted to tons) or a combination thereof may be used for pulp, bolt, or co-mingled material as determined by Clark County. Cord scaled products will be converted to tons using the weights published in the WDNR Timber Sale Handbook except for mixed hardwood pulp and bolts. The Clark County Forest mixed hardwood weight conversion is 4,600 lbs/cd.

Surety Bonds – Specific requirements must be met to qualify as an acceptable form of performance bond. Call the Clark County Forestry and Parks Department for details.

The prospectus/map page is the timber sale bid form. There are blank spaces next to each product to enter bids. Fill out prospectus page accordingly, make photo copies for your own records, and submit. A standard, blank, bid form will also be included in case needed. All bids must be in a sealed envelope plainly marked as follows: TIMBER SALE BID, TRACT #_____. A money order, certified/personal check payable to CLARK COUNTY TREASURER, or cash for a sum not less than 10% of the total bid must accompany such bid. One money order or check may be written to cover the combined bid bond amounts for all bids submitted. If one check is submitted for multiple tracts, put the check in the envelope of the lowest tract number being submitted. If the bid is accepted, the 10% down payment is held until the performance bond requirement is satisfied and a contract is signed. Failure to provide an acceptable bond within 30 days of the contract being awarded may result in forfeiture of the bid bond and resale of the tract.

Bids will be awarded to the highest responsible bidder that is in Clark County's best interest who meets specifications, on a site by site basis. Determination of the highest responsible bidder will be based upon the total bid value and the following criteria as required by the County to verify bidder qualifications to complete the work:

- Adherence to all conditions and requirements of the bid specifications.
- General reputation, prior performance, and experience of the bidder.
- The County's evaluation of the bidder's ability to perform based upon the requirements and references called for in the bid documents.
- Financial responsibility of the bidder.
- Experience of the bidder with this type of project.

All bids must be broken down for each product/volume listed on the tract prospectus and meet or exceed the total minimum bid price listed on page 6. Only <u>Scaled</u> sale bids must meet or exceed the minimum sawlog bid prices listed below. <u>Scaled</u> sale bids that fail to meet these minimums may be rejected. For <u>scaled</u> sale bids, you may bid the same price, <u>but not less</u>, for boltwood material as you do for pulp. If you bid different prices for boltwood vs. pulp, you will be required to sort bolts per specifications on the landing.

Lump Sum Timber Sales: 4-19 - The actual volumes removed may be different than the advertised volumes. Bids still need to be broken down for each product description listed on the tract prospectus. No adjustments to the purchase price or harvest volumes will be made if the harvested volumes differ from estimated volumes. All stumpage will be paid in advance of harvest or arrangements made with the seller prior to harvest for an advanced payment schedule. Minimum sawlog prices do not apply for lump sum timber sales. There are no bidding requirements that apply to boltwood and pulpwood material for lump sum timber sales. During the bid opening, only the total bid value for the tract will be read aloud.

Seasonal Oak Wilt restrictions will be enforced on all or portions of tracts #22-17, 1-19, 2-19, 3-19, 4-19, 6-19, 9-19, 11-19, 16-19, 18-19, and 20-19. No cutting, skidding, or road building will be allowed between April 15th and July 15th annually. The starting date for oak wilt restrictions may vary depending on weather conditions.

HRD (Annosum Root Rot) control work is required on all or portions of tracts #41-16, 55-16, 23-17, 31-18, 5-19, 13-19, 15-19, 21-19, and 23-19. Purchaser shall conduct Annosum Root Rot disease control work. Purchaser shall apply Cellu-Treat fungicide to all conifer stumps within 24 hours of tree cutting. Purchaser shall apply Cellu-Treat according to product label directions. Seller will provide the Cellu-Treat product and dye. Seller will also provide the purchaser with backpack sprayer if needed. Application of Cellu-Treat is not required for harvest operations conducted at temperatures below 32 degrees. It is the responsibility of the contractor to obtain any state licenses or certifications necessary for contractual pesticide applications on Clark County property.

Possible Summer Sales - The following sales are advertised as "possible" summer sales: **Tracts #22-17, 1-19, 4-19, 5-19, 9-19, 11-19, 15-19, 19-19, 21-19 and 23-19.** These sales may have inclusions that require very dry or frozen conditions to operate. Other tracts, not listed above, may have areas that are operable in the summer. This list is included as a reference tool only and no guarantees are implied. <u>Prior to bidding</u>, contractors are strongly encouraged to visit and inspect all tracts they intend to bid on.

Policy for overdue stumpage.

Basswood Sawlogs

- The grace period for stumpage due is 30 days. After 30 days, 18% annual interest rate compounded monthly (1.5%/month) will be applied until the balance is paid in full.
- Interest will not be applied to balances of \$200.00 or less, unless it is a closing contract balance.
- Advance stumpage payment will still be required to purchase haul tickets.

Utilization Allowance for Whole Tree Chippers and Fuelrod Harvesters: The utilization allowance is an adjustment in pulpwood and boltwood stumpage rates to compensate the logger for higher utilization rates. The utilization allowance is calculated as follows:

Total Combined Bid Value of Pulpwood and Boltwood

Estimated Pulpwood and Boltwood Volume X Adjustment Factor = Adjusted Price/Ton

The adjustment factor for whole tree utilization is 1.30. The fuelrod adjustment factor is 1.10.

Purchaser must meet the utilization specifications listed on page 5 to receive the whole tree and fuelrod utilization allowance. Sawlog volume will not receive a utilization allowance and may only be chipped with authorization from the seller.

Peeled Cordwood: All volumes are based on unpeeled stick scale measure. Unless otherwise specified – a cord is 4' x 4' x 100". When peeled cordwood is measured, it is agreed that 12.5% will be added to hand peeled and roller or stroke head processor peeled volumes. Ring debarker and other machine peeled volume adjustment will be handled on a case-by-case basis.

Use of restricted ATV trails, snowmobile trails, game trails and other trails or roads on the County Forest:

- Logging contractors in possession of this prospectus are authorized to travel restricted ATV and snowmobile trails with a car or truck for the purpose of timber sale investigation only.
- Logging contractors in possession of this prospectus are authorized to travel other restricted trails, woods roads or county land with an ATV for the purpose of timber sale investigation only.
- Nothing in the above paragraphs allows anyone to operate a motor vehicle in such a manner as to cause ruts, soil disturbance, other damage, or cross private property without the owner's consent
- Gates will be open from May 2nd through May 8th for the following sales: **Tracts #23-17 and 11-19.**

Workers Compensation insurance will be required. A current "Certificate of Insurance" must be provided before any work begins.

Bids should be made with an as-is understanding. If there is no access road to a job, it is the purchaser's responsibility to create such access unless specified with a contingency. In some cases, navigable streams may be involved. The County will acquire stream-crossing permits from the DNR. Purchaser will reimburse Clark County for any waterway required permit fees. The purchaser is responsible for providing, installing, and removing permitted structures such as culverts or timber bridges. The purchaser is responsible for restoring all stream crossings and/or wetland crossings to presale conditions. Clark County has timber mats that may be used to cross small streams, wetlands, or wet soils available upon request (DNR permit required to cross streams with mats in most cases).

Contract lengths for most timber sales are until May 1, 2021. Tract 1-19, 2-19, 3-19, 18-19, and 20-19: all or portions of the sale area will expire on May 1, 2021 and no extensions will be granted (see prospectus page for details and exceptions). Tract 4-19: all or portions of the sale area will expire on May 1, 2022 and no extensions will be granted (see prospectus page for details and exceptions). Tract 31-18 and 10-19: contract will expire on May 1, 2022 (see prospectus page for details and exceptions). Contract extensions will be considered for all other tracts with the following conditions:

- 1st 1 year extension 5% increase in stumpage rate
- 2nd 1 year extension 10% increase in stumpage rate over and above first extension
- 3rd 1 year extension (and beyond) 15% increase in stumpage rate over and above previous extension or as determined by the Forestry and Parks Committee.

A performance bond is required for each tract. Bond amount for the following tracts will be \$20,000: Tracts #31-18, 3-19, 4-19, 13-19, and 23-19. Bond amounts for all other tracts will be equal to 25% of the total estimated bid value up to \$15,000.00, except no bond will be less than \$3,000.00.

Wisconsin Resale Policy: As required by the Wisconsin Department of Revenue, we must keep a Wisconsin Resale Certificate signed by the purchaser on file or collect tax from the purchaser's stumpage payments. This form certifies the purchaser as a wholesaler and the end consumer will pay the sales tax. Once signed, this certificate does not expire unless canceled by the purchaser or department. If a signed certificate is not already on file with the department the contractor will be notified with their contract award letter.

The scale for all timber sale maps is 4 inches = 1 mile or 1 square inch = 40 acres unless otherwise noted on the sale map.

CUTTING REQUIREMENTS

All designated hardwood thinning areas have the following cutting requirements and operational restrictions:

- Harvest all trees, regardless of merchantability, in accordance with the specifications listed on the tract description page and timber sale map.
- Care must be taken to avoid damaging residual trees.
- No cutting, skidding or road building between April 15 and July 15.
- Road building will be kept to a minimum and residual stems avoided, whenever possible.
- Tree and pole length skidding will be considered on a case by case basis.
- Harvesting and road construction within designated oak and hardwood thinning acreage will not be allowed during the period of two growing seasons before a significant gypsy moth outbreak is expected until two growing seasons following the collapse of gypsy moth populations. The Seller will provide written notification to the Purchaser restricting harvesting and road construction activities. This notification will be given by January 1st of each year for restrictions beginning the following April 1st. The seller will also provide written notification to the Purchaser, lifting the restriction after gypsy moth populations have crashed and trees have been given two growing seasons to recover.

All designated pine and spruce thinnings have the following cutting requirements and operational restrictions:

- Harvest all trees, regardless of merchantability, in accordance with specifications listed on the tract description page and timber sale map
- Care must be taken to avoid damaging residual trees.
- Tree and pole length skidding will be considered on a case by case basis.
- All cut pine and spruce products must be removed from the sale area within two weeks during the period of May 15 through August 15.
- Purchaser shall apply Cellu-Treat fungicide to all conifer stumps within 24 hours of tree cutting. Purchaser shall apply Cellu-Treat according to product label directions. Seller will provide the Cellu-Treat product and dye. Seller will also provide the purchaser with a backpack sprayer if needed. Application of Cellu-Treat is not required if the high temperature on the day of harvest is less than 32 degrees.

All designated regeneration harvests have the following cutting requirements and operational restrictions:

- Harvest all trees in accordance with specifications listed on the tract description page. Avoid
 damage to and no cutting of designated reserve trees, individually marked trees, or wildlife
 islands. Skidding through wildlife islands is only allowed with prior approval of the seller.
- All remaining live trees, 2 inches in diameter at DBH and larger shall be cut, unless otherwise specified on the timber sale map or tract description page.
- Non-merchantable tree stumps shall be no higher than 6 inches.
- To insure and protect aspen regeneration, all trees designated for harvest must be removed with the aspen.

UTILIZATION SPECIFICATIONS

All trees containing one or more 100 inch sticks or 8 foot 6 inch logs, 50% or more merchantable, to the minimum top diameter are considered merchantable.

Whole Tree: No minimum top diameter. Includes all bark and limbs.

Fuelrods: Minimum top diameter will be 2 inches Diameter Outside Bark (DOB) for all

species.

Pulpwood: Minimum top diameter will be 4 inches DOB for all species.

Bolts: Minimum top diameter will be 8 inches Diameter Inside Bark (DIB) for all

species.

Sawlogs: Minimum top diameter will be 10 inches DIB for hardwoods, 9 inches DIB for

pine, and 6 inches DIB for random length pine material.

Co-mingled: When listed on the prospectus, refers to all pulp, bolt, and sawlog volume being

combined and sold for one bid price.


