

What is the CCHD testing for?

• High levels of E. Coli bacteria

The lake has high levels of E. Coli Bacteria... So what?

• High levels of bacteria in the water can make you and your family sick. Swallowing the water can cause diarrhea, nausea, vomiting, fever, and stomach pain.

Where can I find the results?

 Results are posted on the CCHD website and Facebook page almost as soon as we receive them!

Will there be signs posted at the beach if there is an advisory or closure?

 Yes! RED- Closed (Beach is closed for water activites). YELLOW-Advisory (Water activities are not recommended).

GREEN- Swim at your own risk **Results are in cfu/100mL - Levels between 235 - 999 = Advisory - Levels 1,000 or higher = Closure

What happens if a test result comes back high?

• Beach testing takes place every other Monday. If these results are high, then a re-test is done Wednesday.

How long do test results take?

• We typically receive the results within 48 hours and get the information out as fast as we can!

Can I still boat if the lake is closed?

• The lake will still be open for boating and fishing.

If the lake is closed for swimming, does this mean the fish are unsafe to eat?

• We'd recommend rinsing the fish with clean, potable water, not lake water; use clean knives & cutting boards; wash hands well after handling the raw fish; & cook the fish fully to an internal temp of at least 145°F (63°C).

Why do you only test 4 beaches in Clark County?

• We know that there are numerous areas that people can swim in Clark County but we only test the water at designated beach areas.
