

Radon Price Change

During 2024, the Clark County Health Department is offering reduced-priced short-term radon tests, utilizing COVID-19 American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) grant dollars intended to support community recovery.

- The kits will be offered to test Clark County properties.
- The tests will be \$5 per kit if you pick them up from the department, or \$6 if you would like it shipped.
- Kits can be picked up at the Clark County Health Department or mailed.
